Artist trading Cards (or ATCs) are tiny works of art made by artists to try new techniques, test new materials, expand creative ideas, and even trade with other artists. ATCs have only one rule: they must be the size of a trading card (about 2 ½ x 3 ½ in). Because of their small size, this relatively quick process will allow students to explore several 2D art-making techniques including: drawing, painting, watercolor, stamping, mixed media collage, printmaking, photography, and more! Each day we will explore different techniques to apply to the cards. At the end of the camp, students will come home with a series of 10 to 20 (or more!) small artworks that can be traded with other artists, or framed together as a larger piece!


#### FANTASY FOOTBALL (NEW OFFERING)


#### JUNIOR CHEERLEADING Ages 6-10

Students invited and enrolled in the Knight Success Program (KSP) summer course are required to complete this course for entry to JPII. This course is designed to introduce KSP students to JPII's academic expectations. Students will experience aspects of JPII culture, expectations, and begin to develop self-awareness. Students will practice skills based off their learning style and begin to see methods they prefer in studying, preparing, and practicing. Students will be introduced to academic terminology and "best practices" used at JPII such as "annotations" and "DBQ." Students will become familiar with college preparation level writing, active reading, and how to approach science and math. Students will be guided in learning skills, strategies, and tools for organization, preparation, and selfawareness. Students will use the summer reading novel to practice active reading strategies. Please note that this is an invitation only class. If the JPII Admissions Office did not invite your child to take this summer course, they may opt to take the Study Skills course taught by Mrs. Susan Deely during the same time period.



#### **BEGINNING LEVEL ROBOTICS** Ages 10-14

Robotics has three components: mechanical, electronics and programming. Beginner robotics will utilize the mBot, which is scratch-based, and will have very little mechanical build and geared more towards programming. The use of electronic parts such as the line follower sensor, light sensor, ultrasonic distance sensor will make the mBot autonomously move, produce sound, and light. Students will show mastery in controlling their robots by meeting various scaffolded challenges. Industry based Autonomous Vehicle, and VEX competition robots will be shown as well.

Charles Mamolo is the robotics sponsor at JPII. The robotics team had been successful in Autonomous Vehicle competitions at Rose Hulman Institute of Technology. In the last competition, the team has won 9 out 12 possible awards. The team has also recently qualified for the VEX Robotics Competition state championship for being tournament champions at their first try. Mr. Mamolo has been a robotics teacher for the past 4 years, and has taught physics for over 20 years.

Coach Parker has over 300 total wins in his career and has been the TBCA's Sectional Coach of the year four times (2007 Cascade, 2009 Blackman, 2014 Forrest, 2017 JPII.)








HISTORY OF BASEBALL THROUGH KICKBALL AND WIFFLE BALL (NEW OFFERING)
